

The role of Independent Supporters

Independent Supporters can work with you and your child to ensure that your voices are heard. They offer a free, friendly, flexible service for families and young people. They offer support when:

- you have applied for an education, health and care plan (EHCP) for your child
- your child has a statement that is transferring to an EHCP.

They aim to do this by:

- supporting you to understand the legal framework underpinning the changes in SEN
- helping you think through and identify what the changes mean for you
- attending or supporting you at meetings with the local authority or school

What is the Local Offer?

It is a website that includes information about:

- education services from pre-school to further education
- health services which are universal, targeted and specialist
- social care services including short breaks
- preparing for adulthood for young people aged 19 to 25
- training opportunities for young people
- transport arrangements including the SEND transport policy
- arrangements for assessing children and young people
- how to request an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- transferring from a statement of special educational needs to an education, health and care plan
- the option of personal budgets
- making complaints, appeals and tribunals
- information, advice and guidance on funding, financial support and support available from local voluntary organisations.

The website has many accessible features to help people use the information including:

- accessible font
- text only version
- high contrast version
- Dyslexia friendly colour scheme
- ability to change font size
- Google translate in many languages
